ROX RALLY LATE, FALL SHORT AGAINST MANKATO: After scoring a team-best 15 runs on Monday against the MoonDogs, St. Cloud dropped the series finale 6-4 at Franklin Rogers Park. After falling behind 4-0, the Rox strung three consecutive hits together from Andrew Pintar (BYU), Sam Ireland (Minnesota) and Luke Roskam (Nebraska). Nate Rombach (Texas Tech) then put the Rox on the board with a sac-fly to center field. In the eighth inning, Nate Swarts (Washington State) blasted an RBI-double and St. Cloud added three runs. However, the rally fell short and the Rox split the two-game series.

JORDAN BARTH IS RED HOT AT THE PLATE: The 2019 Rox Team MVP has recorded a hit in his last 11 games. He currently leads the squad in batting average, hits, triples, RBI and is tied for the lead in hit-by-pitches. In 2019, the Augustana product set six single season franchise records. He hit .323 last season.

ST. CLOUD GETS SET FOR LONG HOMESTAND: The Rox begin their longest homestand of the season on Wednesday against Rochester. They'll play host to the Honkers today and tomorrow before hosting the Willmar Sting-ers and then the Waterloo Bucks. They won't play a road game until August 6th when they play Rochester at Mayo Field. The Rox are 7-2 this season at home.

ROX VS HONKERS IN 2020: St. Cloud is 3-1 on the season against the Honkers and 2-1 at Joe Faber Field. On July 2nd, the Rox erased a four run deficit and Andrew Pintar (BYU) hit a walk-off in the 11th inning to win 7-6. The next day at Mayo Field, St. Cloud scored eight runs in the eighth inning and won 13-2. The two teams most recently played on July 18th and 19th at Joe Faber Field. The Honkers won game one after a five-run eighth inning. St. Cloud responded with a 9-4 win in the series finale.

HONKERS STARTER RHP CHARLES HARRISON (0-1, 15.58 ERA): The freshman from UCLA makes his fourth start of the season and second against St. Cloud. In 8.2 innings this season, he has given up 15 earned runs and walked 11 batters while striking out just seven. On July 23rd, he went a season-long 4.1 innings in the start against Waterloo but allowed five earned runs. On July 3rd against St. Cloud, Harrison lasted just one inning.

IN A NUTSHELL:

-The Opening Day starter for the Rox makes his fourth start of the season and his second at Joe Foweraker Field

-He comes to the Rox in 2020 following his sophomore season at Washington State. He appeared in four games, three as the Friday-night starter

-He finished the season with a 3-0 record and a 1.44 ERA while striking out 32 batters in 25 innings. Mills was tied for third in the Pac-12 Conference in wins and fourth in strikeouts and innings

-As a freshman in 2019, he made 28 appearances on the mound which is tied for the most by a freshman in Washington State history

-Before Washington State: As a senior at Lincoln High School, he was named All-State First Team, All-USA Oregon Second Team and PIL Pitcher of the Year. He was rated as the No. 4 overall prospect in Oregon by Baseball Northwest

1 Jordan Barth 3B/1B 6-1, 200, Jr. Cold Spring, MN Augustana

- Barth returns to the Rox for his second season. In 2019 he was selected to the postseason Northwoods League All-Star team and participated in the Major League Dreams Showcase
- The 2019 Rox Most Valuable Player appeared in 71 regular season games while leading the team with a .323 batting average. Barth set single season Rox records in hits (99), doubles (25), extra base hits (32), total bases (144), runs scored (54) and games played (71).
- In 13 games for Augustana this year, he led the team with a .471 batting average, 24 hits and six doubles during the 2020 season
- Before Augustana: The Rocori High School graduate earned All-Conference, All-Area and All-State honors. He was selected for the Minnesota Baseball All-Star Series
- Barth is a World Champion in racquetball and is currently ranked No. 43 in the country for men's singles

27 Garrett Delano OF/RHP 6-2, 205, Sr.. Callahan, FL Mercer

- Delano returns for his second season with the Rox after appearing in 62 regular season games in 2019
- He finished the 2019 Northwoods League season with a .320 batting average including 72 hits and a team-high eight home runs and 51 runs batted in (Rox single-season record)
- Delano was named a midseason and postseason Northwoods League All-Star in 2019
- During the 2020 season at Brown University, Delano started all 12 games and scored nine runs
- Delano announced in the spring that he will be transferring to Mercer University

2 Tyler Finke 2B/SS/OF 5-10, 170, So. Columbus, IN SE Louisiana

- Finke returns for this second season with the Rox after playing in 20 games during the 2019 season
- Last season he collected 11 hits, had seven runs batted in and stole eight bases for the Rox
- This season at Southeastern Louisiana, he started all 16 games and posted a .296 batting average. He led the team in hits with 16 and stolen bases with nine
- Before Southeastern Louisiana: Finke played his freshman season at Snead State Community College, where he earned All-North Division and All-District honors, before transferring to Southeastern Louisiana. In high school he was an All-State and two-time All-Conference selection

44 Sam Ireland DH/1B/RF/RHP 6-3, 195, Fr. Highlands Ranch, CO Minnesota

- Ireland appeared in 16 games for the the University of Minnesota in 2020
- He finished with a .303 batting average including four doubles. He scored three runs and had four runs batted in
- On the mound, Ireland finished tied for the team-high in saves and struck out ten batters over eight innings pitched
- Before Minnesota: Ireland was twice named the Class 5A High School Player of the Year in Colorado. Prep Baseball Report rated him the number three overall player in the state of Colorado during his senior season

12 Cody Kelly C/3B/OF 6-2, 190, HS-Sr. St. Michael, MN Minnesota

- Kelly, a 2020 graduate of St. Michael-Albertville, has committed to the University of Minnesota for the upcoming school year
- In 96 career high school games, he had a .466 batting average, 77 runs scored and 111 runs batted in
- He was a two-time First Team All-State selection and the top ranked catcher in Minnesota by Prep Baseball Report
- His brother Jack also plays for the Rox and Golden Gophers

16 Jack Kelly C/1B/OF 6-1, 180, Jr. St. Michael, MN Minnesota

- Kelly returns to the Rox for his second season after appearing in 37 games in 2019. He collected 40 hits including seven doubles, a triple and three home runs. Kelly finished the 2019 Northwoods League season with a .303 batting average, 28 runs scored and 23 runs batted in. Kelly also participated in the Major League Dreams Showcase
- He started all 18 games for the University of Minnesota during the 2020 season, scoring nine runs
- His brother Cody also plays for the Rox. They will be teammates next season at the University of Minnesota
- Before Minnesota: He spent two seasons at Northwestern University before transferring to Minnesota. 8 Nick Marinconz 2B/SS/3B 5-11, 180, Fr. San Jose, CA Cal Poly

- In his first season at Cal Poly, Marinconz appeared in 16 games and hit .215 in 65 at-bats. He also recorded 6 RBIs
- As a rising freshman in college, Marinconz played in the Northwoods League last summer for the Eau Claire Express
- He hit .284 for the season and helped the Express reach the championship game
- Before Cal Poly: A 2019 graduate of Valley Christian High School, Marinconz played baseball in all four years and hit .334 for his career

28 Collin Montez OF 6-2, 210, Jr. Marysville, WA Washington State

- Montez started all 16 games for Washington State in 2020, hitting .283 with four home runs and 17 RBI

10 Ben Norman OF 6-2, 200, RS-Sr.. Des Moines, IA Iowa

- During the 2020 college baseball season, Norman served as Iowa's primary leadoff hitter and batted .295 with 18 runs (tied for third in Big 10) and six RBIs
- He has started in 75 straight games dating back to the 2018 season
- Against Georgetown this season, Norman tied two school records walking four times and scoring five runs in a 22-2 win
- Before Iowa: Ranked by Perfect Game as the No. 1 outfielder in Iowa and No. 6 prospect in the state overall
- Norman's older brother, Sam, played for Iowa in 2017
- His uncle, Bob Bowsby, is the former Athletic Director at Iowa

4 Andrew Pintar SS/2B/3B/RHP 6-2, 190, Fr. Spanish Fork, UT BYU

- In his first season at BYU, Pintar hit .286 in 56 at-bats and knocked in 6 RBIs
- Before BYU: 2019 4A All-State Team and 2019 Daily Herald All-Valley

19 Nate Rombach C/1B 6-5, 225, Fr. Mansfield, TX Texas Tech

- In his first season at Texas Tech, Rombach hit .308 and hit 6 home runs while driving in 27 RBIs
- When the 2020 season ended, the freshman led the Big 12 in home runs and RBIs
- In June, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper named Rombach a Freshman All-American after his stellar freshman campaign
- Before Texas Tech: Rombach was listed as the No. 1 catcher from the state of Texas in the 2019 class by Perfect Game, the No. 29 catcher in the country and the No. 23 overall prospect from Texas. He was taken in the 19th round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Miami Marlins

25 Luke Roskam C/3B/1B/OF 6-2, 220, Sr. Chaska, MN Nebraska

- Roskam appeared in all 15 of Nebraska's games during the 2020 season
- He had a .264 batting average including four doubles and a home run. He scored 12 runs and had 13 runs batted in. As a catcher, he threw out four attempted base stealers
- Before Nebraska: The Chaska graduate was the top ranked catcher and eighth overall ranked player in Minnesota by Perfect Game during his senior year. Roskam was a two-time All-State and three-time All-Metro Conference selection

29 Nate Swartz OF 6-1, 205, Fr. Farmington, NM Washington State

- Swartz hit .133 in 15 at-bats during his freshman season at Washington State
- He appeared in nine games and made six starts in centerfield
- Before Washington State: Attended Piedra Vista High School, where he was named District 1-6A Player of the Year as a junior. Swartz batted .348 and went 9-0 on the mound in 58.1 innings pitched. He originally signed with New Mexico State but signed with Washington State following a coaching change

15 Logan Thomason UTI, SS 6-1, 190, So. Richmond, KY Eastern Kentucky

- Thomason started in all 14 games at shortstop for Eastern Kentucky in 2020. He finished third on the team in batting average (.362) and had 13 RBIs
- He also recorded four doubles, which was fourth best in the Ohio Valley Conference
- As a freshman in 2019, he was named to the OVC All-Freshman Team after appearing in 57 games and starting 52 games
- Before Eastern Kentucky: Played four years at Madison Central High School, where he helped his team win a region championship and was named MVP of the tournament

-In 2019, he led the MAC (during conference play) in ERA (.147), opposing batting average (.167), fewest hits allowed (20), fewest runs allowed (6) and fewest earned runs allowed (6)
-Before Kent State: Led Fishers High School to a state championship in his senior season. Carried a 2.96 career ERA with 16 wins and 143 innings pitched

13 Jesse Barron RHP 5-11, 170, Fr. San Ramon, CA San Francisco

-Barron joins the Rox following a Freshman All-American campaign at the University of San Francisco. In his first season, he carried a 0.96 ERA and had a team-high two saves in 9.1 innings pitched
-He struck out 14 batters and walked just two batters. He allowed just one extra-base hit against the 36 batters he faced in the 2020 season
-Before San Francisco: A three-year letterwinner and two-way player at Dougherty Valley High School. Struck out 97 batters and walked just 12 batters in over 75 innings

21 Landen Bourassa RHP 6-4, 200, Sr. Lethbridge, AB San Francisco

-Bourassa made four starts on the mound for the University of San Francisco this season
-He finished the 2020 season with a 1-1 records and a 1.38 earned run average in 13 innings pitched
-Before San Francisco: He transferred after playing two seasons at Lane Community College. At Lane he First Team NWAC All-Region honors. In his two seasons he finished with a 9-4 records and 2.63 earned run average. He was named to the First Team All-State Montana/Alberta during his senior year at Chinook High

55 Kevin Davis RHP 6-9, 260, Jr. Orland Park, IL USC Upstate

-Before LIU-Brooklyn: He was named to the All-Brooklyn/Queens First Team and All-City second team during his senior season at Xaverian High School.

7 Josh Gainer RHP 6-1, 200, Jr. Parma, OH LIU-Brooklyn

-In his first season at LIU-Brooklyn, Gainer made four relief appearances in 4.0 innings of work on the mound and gave up just one run
-In 2019, he appeared in 16 games for Glendale Community College
-Before LIU-Brooklyn: Earned four varsity letters in baseball and was named the 2017 Normandy High School Athlete of the Year

32 Tyson Heaton RHP 6-2, 200, Fr. Yucaipa, CA BYU

-In his first season at BYU, Heaton appeared in seven games on the mound and went 2-0 on the season. In 11.1 innings pitched, he struck out nine batters and finished with a 6.35 ERA
-Before BYU: Heaton was drafted in the 40th round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels. He was ranked the 18th-best-right-handed pitcher in California and 327th player in the nation. Heaton set the Yucaipa High School record for wins in a career with 32. In March of 2019, he threw a perfect game and struck out nine batters

22 Justin Kelly RHP 6-1, 180, RS-So. West Jordan, UT Utah

-Kelly made four starts on the mound this season for Utah
-He finished with a 2.66 earned run average. In 23.2 innings pitched, he struck out 14 batters
-Before Utah: At Copper Hills High School, Kelly earned All-Region and Honorable Mention All-State honors following his senior season. He was also a member of the Class 5A North All-Star Team

30 Trevor Koenig LHP 7-0, 185, Jr. St. Cloud, MN St. Cloud State

-Koenig returns to the Rox for his second season after being named the Rox Pitcher of the Year in 2019. He started game one of the Northwoods League Playoffs for the Rox
-He was also selected as a Midseason and Postseason Northwoods League All-Star. He made 10 regular season starts on the mound while posting a 1.35 earned run average
-Koenig tied the Rox single season record for wins with a 7-2 record in 60 innings pitched
-He made four appearances for St. Cloud State in 2020, striking out 18 batters in 10.1 innings

6 Nate Peterson LHP 5-10, 185, So. Lakeville, MN Oklahoma State

- Peterson pitched in 2.2 innings for Oklahoma State in the shortened 2020 college baseball season
- During his freshman season, he appeared in 11 games and threw 13 innings. He 16 batters and finished with a 3.46 ERA
- Before Oklahoma State: In his senior season at Lakeville High School, Peterson turned in a 0.49 ERA and collected 87 strikeouts in 42 innings pitched. He had a 20-strikeout game and tossed three-no hitters during his high school career

31 Trent Schoeberl RHP 6-6, 190, Fr. White Bear Lake, MN Minnesota

- Schoeberl appeared in five games, making three starts on the mound for the Gophers during the 2020 season
- He finished with a 2-0 record and a 2.75 earned run average. He finished with 17 strikeouts over 19 2/3 innings pitched
- Before Minnesota: The White Bear Lake graduate was ranked by Perfect Game as the 3rd best right-handed pitcher and 5th best high school player in Minnesota

33 Blake Stelzer RHP 6-3, 209, Sr. Lakeville, MN Concordia-St. Paul

- Stelzer returns for his second season with the Rox after an impressive summer in 2019
- He finished with a team-high five saves after pitching in 33.2 innings and carrying a 2.13 ERA
- During the 2020 collegiate baseball season, Stelzer led the NSIC with a 0.52 ERA and his 25 strikeouts were third best in the conference
- Before Concordia-St. Paul: He spent one season at Rochester Community & Technical College. As a senior at Lakeville High School, he led his team to a fourth-place finish at the MSHSL State Tournament despite a 2-17 regular season record

26 Joey Stock RHP 6-5, 215, Sr. Cold Spring, MN Wisconsin-Milwaukee

- Stock returns to the Rox in 2020 for his third season with the team
- In the summer of 2019, he went 0-1 on the mound in 18 innings pitched and struck out 18 batters while collecting three saves
- During his final season with St. Johns (MN) in the 2020 season, Stock finished 1-1 in four innings pitched and recorded a save. He struck out nine batters
- Stock recently announced that he will be transferring to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee for his final season of eligibility
- Before St. Johns (MN): Stock graduated from St. John's Prep in 2016 and played for head coach Thomas Grandy

24 Brandon White RHP 6-8, 220, So. Chehalis, WA Washington State

- White made two starts for Washington State in 2020, finishing with a 0-0 record in 4.2 innings and struck out 9 batters
- In the 2019 season for the Cougars, he tied the school record for starts by a freshman with 15. He recorded 49 strikeouts, fifth-most in WSU history by a freshman
- In his first career start, White took a no-hitter into the seventh inning, struck out nine and earned the win

ROX FIELD MANAGER: AUGIE RODRIGUEZ

FIELD MANAGER/PITCHING COACH - AUGIE RODRIGUEZ

Rodriguez is in his ninth year with the Rox organization and eighth overall as Field Manager. He has posted a career record of 292-218 (.572) with the Rox which places him fourth all-time among the winningest managers in Northwoods League history. Rodriguez has led the Rox to two Northwoods World Series appearances (2015 & 2017), including a NWL Championship in 2017. Rodriguez was named Northwoods League Manager-of-the-Year in 2016. In addition to his duties with the Rox, he also serves as an Associate Scout for the Cincinnati Reds and as a trainer at MASH Baseball in St. Cloud. Augie played six years of professional baseball starting with the Seattle Mariners, who invited him to spring training in 2003. He spent two seasons playing in the Puerto Rican Major Winter League and one year in the European Association of Professional Baseball. From 2011-2013 he was the pitching coach at Augusta State University in Augusta, Georgia. Over 80 of his former Rox players have been drafted or signed as free agents by Major League Baseball teams, including Will Craig (2016) and Michael Busch (2017) who were selected in the first round of the Major League Draft. Augie resides in St. Joseph, Minnesota with his wife Rachael and son AJ.



ROX ASSISTANT COACHES

ASSISTANT COACH (3RD BASE COACH) - ALEX MIKLOS

Miklos is in his second season with the Rox as an assistant coach after helping the team reach a record of 44-28 in 2019. He played for Kent State University from 2012 until 2016. During that time with the Golden Flashes, he was First Team All-Region and First-Team All-MAC. He currently holds the school record for triples (15). He currently serves as an assistant coach for South Dakota State University.

ASSISTANT COACH (1ST BASE COACH) - DAVID BELLAMY

Bellamy rejoins the Rox coaching staff for his second season after helping the club produce a 44-28 win-loss record in 2019. He comes back to St. Cloud after serving as a Graduate Assistant for Washington State University during their abbreviated 2020 season. David also held a similar capacity with his alma-mater at New Mexico State University a year ago before his first coaching stint with the Rox and was part of the Aggies winning the Western Athletic Conference Regular Season Championship.
